WELCOME TO EXETER HIGH SCHOOL

Welcome to Exeter High School. This booklet is to help you get to know what goes on in our school.

Exeter High is an excellent school. Our school values are: Respect, Learning, Maturity and Acceptance. The most important activities that go on in our school are about learning. Learning is exciting, particularly if you think about how your skills are improving and how what you've learned helps you to learn even more. We expect you to concentrate on your lessons and to work hard at all times. We want you to be successful at our school and we will help you as much as we can to achieve success.

We care about our students and teachers want to help you with any problems you have, so make sure you ask for help when you need it.

It is great to be involved in the activities that go on in our school. There are plenty of these for example: visiting performers, the Launceston Drama Competitions, Student Leaders' Council, sports carnivals, lunchtime activities, socials, sports teams, arts evenings etc.

Every year many people in our school do just that, work towards building a positive future. Individuals and groups tackle enormous challenges and often achieve more than they expect through hard work, initiative, courage and by exploring what is possible.

Our aim is to give you the best possible education in a supportive and caring environment. We care about whether you are happy, whether you are getting on well with other students and teachers and whether you are giving yourself every chance to do as well as you possibly can in your studies.

We are immensely proud of our excellent school and are pleased to welcome you to Exeter High.

Grade Leader and Core Teachers

Each grade has a Grade Leader. Your Grade Leader is the person who looks after your grade - they are there to help you.

Your Core Teachers are the people who look after your class group. They will be one of your main teachers. Each day Lesson I begins with an attendance check and your teacher will let you know about what is going on in our school on that day.

If you have any problems with your work or with getting along with someone else then you must see your Core Teacher and/or your Grade Leader. They are there to support you.

What is Our School Uniform?

Our uniform policy has been developed in consultation with our School Association so students must wear their school uniform every day. Students at Exeter High School have both a summer and winter school uniform. See the 2021 School Student Dress Code and Uniform Policy.

Non-school jumpers, hoodies, jeans, board shorts and tights are not part of our school uniform and must not be worn.

Arrival at School

On arrival at school, students should move well inside the school grounds to designated areas. Waiting at fences and gateways is unacceptable.

After arriving at school students are not permitted to leave. When students get off their bus they **must move directly into school**. Walking up the street or into the town centre is not permitted.

Students should not be here before staff duty commences at 8.35 am.

Students should move to their Core class room at the first siren at 8:55am, ready for a 9:00am start.

What if I'm late for school?

If you arrive at school after 9:00am you MUST go to our Administration office and get your name signed into the "Late Book". You will need to have a note from your parent or guardian, or they must come in with you to explain why you are late.



What Are Our School Times?

School begins each day at **9:00am** and we go home at 3.10pm. At the start of the year you will be given a computer printout of your timetable. Keep the copy at school and take a copy home so you know when to bring in items for specific lessons, ie PE uniform or a cooking container etc.

All students are expected to follow their timetable.

of Lesson I. Lesson I: 9:00am to 10:40am

Recess: 10:40am to 11:00am Lesson 2: 11:05am to 12:45pm

Lunch: 12:45pm to 1:25pm

Lesson 3: 1:30pm to 3:10pm

What about Lunchtime?

Everyone has a lunch break of 40 minutes. You may bring a cut lunch to school, order your lunch online via the Qkr! app (see page 23 for details) or order your lunch from our school canteen in our Student Centre, at the beginning of the day.

Our canteen is open at recess and lunch until 1:25pm every day. A variety of hot and cold food is available at recess and lunchtime.

Mrs Blazely runs our school canteen with the help of some volunteer parents.

Will I get Reports?

We like to let you know how you are going with your learning. You will receive three reports each year (an Interim report at the end of Term I, a written report mid-year and an end of year report). We also hold Parent/Teacher/Student evenings twice a year that give you and your parents/carers an opportunity to talk to your teachers about how you are getting on.

Your parents can contact us at any time to find out how you are progressing and we would like them to do so. If you or your parents/carers would like more frequent written reports we can arrange this if you ask.

Will I get homework?

We think that homework is important. Regular homework will help you to develop good study habits.

You will be given homework in some subjects on a regular basis. Sometimes this will involve finishing off work started in class, at other times it will be a special homework assignment designed to be completed at home or revising for tests. Keeping up with current

events by watching news programs and reading newspapers is very important and reading for pleasure is also an excellent form of homework. If you think about it you will never have "no homework", there is always something extra you can do at home.



Where can I put my things?

These can be stored in your Core classroom. Do not leave valuables in bags (e.g. money, mobile phones, electronic devices).

Valuables should not be brought to school unless they are needed for classes in which case they can be left at the Administration Office.

Other items that students may need after school (eg sports gear) can also be left at the Administration Office for safe keeping.

What if I need to leave class?

Students need a legitimate reason to leave class, must be in correct uniform and have a *Permission to Leave Class* slip signed by their teacher. Note that toilet visits should occur at break times unless there is a medical issue or an emergency (in which case the uniform rule will not apply).

Student Leaders' Council (SLC)

The Student Leaders' Council is a group of Grade ten students who have been elected by students and staff. They are elected to provide student leadership, to represent our school in a positive way, to help our students put forward their opinions and to organise activities.

Grade 7, 8 and 9 students also have leadership opportunities through their grade SRC (Student Representative Council).

Our Library & Resource Centre

You will use our library a lot while you are at Exeter High. We have junior and senior fiction titles, picture books and non-fiction titles. We also have computers in our library where you can word process and access the internet. Daily newspapers are available also.

Our library is open from 8:30-8:55am most mornings as well as during class time and at lunchtimes on specific days.

What If I Lose Something?

If you lose something please see your Core Teacher or Grade Leader. It helps if you make sure everything you bring to school is clearly named.

It is best not to bring valuable things to school.

If you do have something valuable at school you should leave it at our Administration Office.

Personal items such as mobile phones etc bought to school are the responsibility of the student as the school cannot be held responsible for the loss or theft of property.

What do I do if I am Absent?

It important that you attend school every day. If you are absent for any reason your Parent/Carer <u>must</u> advise the school about why you are absent.



- Your parent/carer can phone our Administration Office on the day to let us know why you are absent or
- Your Parent/Carer can use the Absence form on the Szapp App.
- Your Parent/Carer can also email the school to advise of your absence (exeter.high@education.tas.gov.au), or
- On the first day you return to school you can bring a note to the Administration Office from your Parent/Carer explaining why you have been away.
- The school also has an answering machine to record messages when our office is unattended.



If you are absent without an explanation on any day then your first Contact will be sent an SMS. Parent/Carers can respond directly to this SMS.

What do I do if I Need To Leave Our School Grounds?

You are <u>not allowed</u> to leave our school grounds during any part of our school day unless you have a note from your parent/carer.

If you do have to leave school for any reason you need to:

- I. Show your note to our Administration Office before Lesson I so a Leave Pass can be issued.
- 2. When you have to leave, show the Leave Pass you have been given to your class teacher.
- 3. Before leaving our school go to our Administration Office and sign our Leave Book. This is a legal requirement.
- 4 When you arrive back at school go to our office and sign back in the Leave Book. This is a legal requirement.
- 5 If you arrive late you MUST report to the Administration Office and sign in with your parent/carer, or with a note of explanation.

 This is a legal requirement.

*** Please note that you <u>WILL NOT</u> be allowed to leave our school at recess or lunch time to go to the shop. ***

PARENTS: What do you need to do when collecting your child from school?

- I. Send a note with your child/ren, OR
- 2. Phone the school so as we can organise for your child to be at the Administration Office when you arrive.
- 3. You must sign your child/ren out at the Administration Office. This is a legal requirement.

We have a very clear mobile phone policy which states students "will keep their phones on silent during class time and only make or answer calls and messages outside of learning sessions".

Your support with this is appreciated and as such we ask that you do not make direct contact with your child. If you need to contact them please do it outside learning sessions or go through our Administration Office.

(Morning tea break 10:40am—11:00am, Lunch break 12:45pm—1.25pm)

What Happens if I Feel Sick or Get Hurt?

If you are feeling UNWELL or need FIRST AID?

Your first point of call for First Aid issues that take place at school is the Administration Office.

Students will be assessed and treated with First Aid. Parents will be notified with a phone call to follow up on further treatment, if required.



If students are feeling unwell they should obtain a note from their class teacher and report to the Administration Office where they will be seen by one of our First Aid Officers for assessment. If the student needs to go home our First Aid Officer or Administration staff will contact parents/carers and organise for the student to be collected. It is extremely important that parents/carers advise the school office of any change to their contact numbers.

Students are **NOT** to phone or text parents/carers themselves, they must go to First Aid. We have a duty of care requirement and must document all cases presented at First Aid.

It is essential that the above procedures are adhered to and we thank everyone for their co-operation with these procedures.

Medications:

If you have to take medication while you are at school an Administration of Medication Authorisation Form must be completed by your parent/carer. **This includes prescribed and non-prescribed medication.**

Authorisation by a doctor, dispensing pharmacist or nurse is required for the administration of ALL PRESCRIBED MEDICATION.

The School can only accept prescribed medication provided in the unopened, dispensed, labelled container, or the original over-the-counter packaging for non-prescribed medication.

All prescribed medication for a student is kept at the Administration Office.

What do I do if I need Help?

If you have any problems the first person you should see is your Core Teacher and then your Grade Leader. If you are experiencing a problem in class always try to discuss it with your subject teacher first. They will be more than pleased to help you. We also have a Social Worker—Lauren Brown, School Psychologist—David McCormack, Chaplain—Paul Burton and School Nurse—Dave Mackay at our school. These people are highly trained and want to help you and your family in any way they can.

If you make an appointment with our Social Worker, School Psychologist, Chaplain or School Nurse what you discuss with them is confidential so you can discuss any problems or concerns (eg. personal, family, school or friendship problems). You can make an appointment directly with any of these people or you can ask a teacher, parent, friend or the Administration Office to make an appointment for you.

What about Sport?



Our school has swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals and we take part in the Inter-High Carnivals in Launceston giving you the chance to represent our school and compete against students from other schools. We have three houses for our school competitions. To represent


our school you must be in full school uniform every day.



Students wear house-coloured t-shirts for our house competitions, or you can purchase a Sports Singlet through our Uniform Shop. Students also have **the opportunity to participate** in after school sports.

What About Bullying? We say "NO" to bullying at Exeter High!

There is a lot less bullying at high school than you may think. If anyone does give you or a friend a hard time **report it to your Core Teacher or Grade Leader immediately.** If you don't feel comfortable telling a



teacher, one of our SLC members could also help. We also have a very strong Respectful Behaviour Policy at Exeter High School.

Bullying – verbal, physical or sexual - is not okay at our school. We show bullies that their behaviour will not be tolerated and that we all have a right to feel safe and be safe.

The consumption of energy drinks are prohibited at Exeter High School and whilst on school buses to and from school.

Mobile phone & electronic devices at school

We have a detailed ICT Policy for all mobile and electronic devices. All students and their parent/carers are required to agree to and sign the agreement at the beginning of each year.

Students may only use their mobile phone or iPod before school, at recess, at lunch or after school.

Please read the full policy for more details.



NOTE. Blades of any sort, lighters, matches, cigarettes and alcohol are not permitted at our school.

Also chewing gum and Aerosol cans (eg. deodorant) are also not permitted.

Sun Awareness

We abide by the Department of Education's Sun Smart Policy and we are very conscious of this important issue. We encourage all people to wear hats and sunscreen outside.

Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) / Restorative Practice

We are a restorative community. Our priority is to address issues and resolve problems. We work together to help students build skills which enable them to enjoy positive relationships with fellow students and adults in our school community. Sometimes things go wrong and when they do we do our best to solve the problem and fix the relationship by asking the following questions:

Person responsible for harm:

- What is happening?
- What are you thinking about?
- Who is being affected by your actions?
- How do you think they are being affected?
- What do you need to put things right?
- · How are we going to stop this from happening again?

Person Affected:

- What did you think when your realised what had happened?
- What impact has this incident had on you and others?
- What has been the hardest thing for you?
- What do you think needs to happen to make things right?

Szapp — Communication App



Qkr! App—Canteen ordering



Introducing Qkr! (pronounced 'quicker') by Mastercard, the secure and easy way to order and pay for school items from your phone at a time and place that suits you. There is no cost involved.

With Qkr you can:

- Order and pay for your child's recess or lunch, reducing the need to bring cash to school;
- · Pay for a variety of school items;
- See your receipts on the app and get them sent by email if required.

Apple or Android Devices:

- 1. On your device, open the App Store, or Google Play for Android
- 2. Search for the Qkr! By Mastercard App
- 3. Download and install the Qkr! App.
- 4. Select your Country of Residence as Australia and follow the steps to register.
- 5. Exeter High School should appear in 'Nearby Locations' or search for our school name.
- 6. When first using the Qkr! App you will be prompted to add your child's profile to allow you to order and make payments for them.

The Qkr! App is already available for Canteen orders—place your order **prior to 9:00am** daily or place an order up to a week in advance.


A Final Word
